To be prepared for class in 6th-8th grade, students must bring their Simple Solutions - Study Skills text, a silent reading book, and pencil case each week. ANY WORK NOT COMPLETED DURING CLASS WILL BE ASSIGNED AS HOMEWORK, DUE FOR THE NEXT CLASS.


