La Salle Academy Athletic / Extra-Curricular Expectations

All students participating in athletics and/or extra-curricular programs at La Salle Academy must realize that such participation is a privilege, which carries with it the responsibility of reflecting actions and behaviors that are respectful to fellow participants, team members, coaches, parents and most importantly to themselves. This includes all policies dictated by La Salle Academy and the Diocese of Scranton Student Handbook.

The goal of all school related programs is to promote values of good sportsmanship, cooperation and fair competition/participation. For this reason, membership is not determine by talent, but rather a willingness to work for the good of the team/club. Consequently, below the Junior High level of play, in both the boys and girls basketball program, coaches are required to play each child at least one quarter in every game played.

In all athletic programs, scheduled practices are required for membership on the team. If an athlete repeatedly misses practice, game play will not be guaranteed at any level. Participation in game play will be at the discretion of the coach.

All students will play at their grade level, unless it becomes necessary for the Athletic Director to move a student to a higher level of play to adequately organize teams. Administration and the Athletic Director of the school will make this determination, if and when necessary. Students in 7th Grade are eligible to play at the Jr. Varsity and Varsity level.

In order to be eligible to participate in any school activities, athletic and/or extra-curricular, the participant must constantly maintain an academic grade of a minimum of a 75 / C or above in each subject area. It is also expected that the participant remain in good standing with the Behavior Expectation Policy of the school and diocese.

If a student's grade average in any class falls below a 75, he/she will be suspended from all athletic/extra-curricular activities (including practices and games/productions) for a period of 10 calendar days. After this period, if a students' grades average raises to the 75 or above, he/she may return to all activities.

If a student continues to fall below the expected grade in any class, he/she will be suspended for an additional 2 weeks, and continuation in all athletic/extracurricular participation will be in jeopardy. A Parent Conference will be required with Administration/ Athletic Director for the possibility of the student's continuation in the program.

Athletes who achieves 1000 points in his/her Jr. High basketball career will receive recognition at a ceremony at a LSA Game. This recognition is merited for points scored at the Jr. Varsity / Varsity level of play ONLY.

Behavior Expectations

To reflect the Mission of LaSalle Academy, and to demonstrate the acceptance of Christ as our role model, the following behavior expectations have been developed for students in grades 4-8.

The following violations/actions warrant a consequence as indicated below:

Level 1 Violation

- A. Chewing gum anywhere on the school grounds
- B. Possession of any object that disrupts the learning process
- C. Late assignments/unprepared for class
- D. Two or more missing assignments
- E. Use of language and actions that are not becoming of a Christian who respects himself/herself and others
- F. Loud and disruptive behavior in school
- G. Violation of uniform dress code; including, but not limited to: hair policy, skirt length, eye makeup, excessive jewelry and shoe policy
- H. Irreverence during prayer and liturgical celebration
- I. Disregard for classroom/school rules
- J. Not participating and/or completing classroom assignments
- K. Inappropriate physical contact
- L. 2nd offense of bullying behavior

Level 2 Violation

- M. Use of personal electronic devices in school, including cell phones and Smart Watches, from entrance into the building until student is in mode of transportation home. This includes the After Care Program and after school clubs and practices.
 - All electronic devices must be turned in to the homeroom teacher and will be returned at the end of the day. During all after school activities and programs, all electronic devices, including cell phones, must be kept in the student's back pack. The school will not assume responsibility for loss or theft.

Immediate Dismissal

The following activities will result in notification to proper legal authorities and immediate dismissal.

- Association or any involvement in gang activity

Behavior Expectations Referral Form

If a student violates the behavior expectations, he/she will be issued a Disciplinary Referral / Detention Form that will be mailed to the parents/guardians indicating the unacceptable behavior and the assigned consequences that are explained below. It is the responsibility of the student to return the signed form the following school day to their homeroom teacher.

Disciplinary Consequences

- A Level 1 violation warrants one demerit. An accumulation of three demerits in Level 1 will warrant a detention. Further level one demerits will accumulate into another detention.
- A Level 2 violation warrants one immediate detention.
- All detentions will be held on the day and date indicated on the monthly calendar.
- Detention will be held from dismissal until 3:30 PM. Parents are responsible for picking up their child. No bus service will be available at this time.
- If a student misses a scheduled detention, the student will receive an immediate second detention.
- Any student serving a second detention or any suspension will be suspended from all athletic and extra-curricular activities for a period of one week. Practice sessions are included. A Parent-Teacher Conference will be mandatory.
- Students issued a 3rd detention, a suspension or non-compliance with scheduled detentions will be required to sign an Academic / Behavior Contract. All agreed upon stipulations in this contract must be upheld by the student for continued participation in school trips, athletics and extra-curricular activities. Continued non-compliant behavior will result in a mandatory Disciplinary Review Board Meting. This board, comprised of a diocesan administrative team will review a students records to determine the appropriate plan of action for the student. The student and his/her parents **MUST** be present at this meeting.

To establish and maintain a consistent discipline policy in Grades Kindergarten through Third, a "Turn A Card" system will be implemented. The goal is to promote "self-discipline", so that each child is accountable for his/her actions and accepts consequences for inappropriate behaviors that infringe upon the rights of others. It will also allow parents to track their child's progress and prevent minor infractions from escalating into major problems.

Four cards are in place for each child.

1st Card	Green	Indicates good/positive behavior	
2nd Card	Wollow	Warning	
3 rd Card	Ownge	Five-minute time out	
4 th Card	Red	Ten-minute time out and child's parent will be notified either by a note or telephone call	

At the end of each day, a child's cards are returned to their original order, indicating a fresh start and another chance at displaying appropriate behavior.

If a child consistently turns a 4th card, the principal will be asked to become involved in the discipline process, and parents will be called in for a conference to discuss actions to help alleviate the inappropriate behavior.

STUDENT DROP - OFF / PICK - UP PROCEDURES

All parents (Grade K-8) must use the car pick up line on the side of the building. (Same as previous years) Please note that parents are not allowed to pick up at the main entrance or enter the building for early pickup, except in the case of an emergency.

To ensure student safety, we are asking all parents and designated family members to please adhere to the following policy for dropping off and picking up your child/children by car.

- 1. All parents are to utilize the drop off and pick up car line in the morning and dismissal daily. Teachers /Staff will be available in the morning and afternoon to expedite the flow of traffic.
- 2. Parents are asked to follow the flow of traffic entering the parking lot on Church Street and exiting the parking lot by way of the alley that runs along Kids' Korner.
- 3. SINGLE LANE ONLY FOR DROP OFF Follow the flow of traffic around the parking lot dropping off your child/children at the Main Entrance. Parents cannot walk their child/children into the building. For the safety of everyone, only students can exit the car for drop off.
- 4. All cars exiting the parking lot will follow the flow of traffic down to the alley. (Right turn to Erie Street) Please do turn left and cut through the buses.
- 5. To avoid congestion, please do not come before your child's dismissal schedule.
- 6. Families with older students will pick up and drop off at the older students designated time.
- 7. Any student transported by car that arrives before 7:45 AM or 9:45AM on late start days will be dropped off at the gym entrance door on 1st Avenue for before care supervision which will be housed in the gym in the morning hours. Parents are asked to call the contact number that will be provided for your arrival if you are using this service. Before care is available beginning at 7:00 AM on Regular Days and 9:00 on Late Start Day.
- 8. PICK-UP PROCEDURES for ALL Grades (Kindergarten Grade 8) Please form three lanes as you enter the parking lot and students will be exiting from the far-right side of the building. Please take turns by alternating lanes as you pick up your child/children to help keep traffic from backing up on Church Street.

Again, we ask all families to follow the Pick-Up Schedule listed above. Please realize that as we begin the year it will take time to establish a routine.

 - Any representative who falls below these requirements is subject to probation and removal from office by vote of the Student Council Administrative Council. Any behavior deemed inappropriate, including academic and/or conduct violations over 3 demerits or over 1 detention will be deemed cause for removal from office.
- 5. A student who wants to be considered for the position of a classroom representative should prepare a short speech to be presented to their class on Monday, September 12, 2022 or Tuesday, September 13, 2022, at a time designated by their homeroom teacher. Student Council Representative elections will be held on Thursday, September 15, 2022...

CANDIDATE RULES AND REGULATIONS

The offices of president, vice president, secretary and treasurer are open to any incoming eighth grade student who meets all qualifications stated below:

- 1. Candidates must have maintained at least an **85 Average** with no grade lower than an **80** in any subject during the first 3 quarters of the current school year.
- 2. A candidate may not have accumulated 5 or more Level 1 demerits or a Level 2 demerit with any additional demerits up to the date elections are held. A candidate may not have served a suspension of any kind or be on a behavior contract at the time of the election or during their time in office.
- 3. A candidate must also demonstrate responsibility and respect. Overall conduct, completion of assignments/homework, adherence to dress code, respect for school rules and authority, or any expectations stated in our school's handbook and/ or Behavior Expectations will be reviewed to demonstrate responsibility and respect in consideration of a candidate's qualification for office.
- 4. In addition, officers are role models to the other students in their words, behaviors and academics. Any officer who falls below these requirements is subject to probation and removal from office by vote of the Student Council Administrative Council. Any behavior deemed inappropriate, including academic and/or conduct violations over 3 demerits or over 1 detention will be deemed cause for removal from office.
- 4. All candidates will be required to give a speech to students in Grades 6,7,8 Via Google Meet. The speech should highlight what the student believes to be his or her qualifications as a leader and what the student believes he or she can offer the Student Council and La Salle Academy School Community. This will be the only platform for a candidate to share their thoughts...no campaigning with signs or items will be allowed.
- 5. The speech must be a minute and a half to two minutes in duration. A typed or legibly handwritten copy of the speech is to be submitted to Mrs. DeMark by Friday, June 2, 2023. The speech will be reviewed by Mrs. Murphy and Mrs. DeMark to ensure that the student's goals and expectations are realistic and acceptable.
- 6. A candidate who significantly deviates from the submitted speech with any form of unacceptable ideas will be stopped and removed from the ballot.
- 7. Speeches will be presented on Wednesday, June 7, 2023, followed by the election.

Grades 6-7-8 will be eligible for the honor roll. At the end of the quarter the honor roll students will receive a certificate. Major subjects are all subjects other than music, physical education, art, computer, and library.

Principal List: All grades 95 or above in all major subjects; no I's; no negative comments on report card, demerits or detentions.

High Honors: overall average of 93% in all major subjects, with no grade lower than 88.

Honors: overall average of 88% or above in all major subjects, with no grade lower than 83.

If a child receives two I's (Improvement needed) marks in special subject areas (i.e. music, physical education, art, computers, foreign language) he/she is not eligible for the honor roll. A mark of U will also result in a student being ineligible for the honor roll.

Negative comments on the report card, may make the student ineligible for the honor roll.

MEDICATION POLICY

It is preferable that any medication, prescription or non-prescription, be given before or after school hours. However, if it is essential that a student receive medication during school hours the following criteria must be *strictly* be adhered to:

- 1. A physician or licensed medical personnel completes a prescription medication form previous to the administering of any medication.
- 2. A parent or legal guardian must sign a separate consent form previous to the administering of any medication.
- 3. Any medication to be given during school hours must be brought to the administrative office by a parent or legal guardian. The medication must be brought to the school in the original pharmaceutically dispensed and properly current labeled container.
- 4. Cough drops and throat lozenges are included under the Medication Policy and need a medication consent form signed for dispensing.

 Therefore, no cough drops or lozenges will be dispensed to students without a signed parental medication form. All cough drops or lozenges must be left with the teacher.
- 5. All medication requests must be renewed at the beginning of each school year.
- 6. The initial dose of medication will not be given at school except in a life-threatening situation.

ALL medication request forms are included in the summer mailing and in the student handbook. Extra forms are available in the school office.





- Has a fever of 100 degrees or higher
- Has been vomiting or has diarrhea
- Has a very red, irritated eye/eyes
- Has a rash not evaluated by a medical provider
 - Has a severe sore throat
 - Has head lice or nits
- Has symptoms that keep your child from participating in school, such as
 - Very tired or lack of appetite
 - O Deep or uncontrollable cough
 - O Severe pain from earache, stomach ache, body aches, or headache
- Keep your child home if he/she is coughing or sneezing often because this spreads the sickness to others.

24 Hour Rule:

- FEVER: Keep your child home until his/her FEVER has been gone WITHOUT medicine for 24 hours.
 - VOMITING OR DIARRHEA: Keep your child home for 24 hours after the LAST time he or she has vomited or had diarrhea and is eating a normal diet.
- **ANTIBIOTICS:** Keep your child home at least 24 hours after the FIRST dose of antibiotic.


